TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Message from the Pastor

The Peace of Christ be with you all!

We celebrate this Sunday the Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. On the First Reading from the Book of Wisdom, it is presented to us a plot against a righteous person who claims to follow God's ways and be faithful to Him. This reading has been accomplished in Christ's Passion on which He was put to the test in order to see if He was going to be faithful to God in the midst of rejection and suffering. Sustained by submission to God, Christ remained at peace, and He did not defend Himself. It is an encouragement to realize that, relying in God, we can be at peace in front of all the struggles that we may face. The Second Reading, from the Letter to James, shows how when conflicts and disputes arise amongst people it is because we are not leaning on Christ. We need to turn to Him and ask God for God's wisdom so that it may touch our hearts so that we can live at peace with others. In the Gospel, from St. Mark, Christ announces for the second time to his disciples that He will be put to death, but He will rise from death. The disciples misunderstand the message, and they start arguing who is going to take over after Christ is gone. It is a temptation that all of us have: to be the first, to be in control, to be in command. However, when we put our foot down and we are in charge, it does not mean that we are at peace. There is the risk that we expect people to be in a certain way and we demand from them. The way of Christ is one of service. A person who "is in charge" is the one who serves the others, who looks for the benefit of others. Moreover, we do not expect people to be different and we do not demand anything from them. We serve them and love them, doing what is best for them. This is the path to fullness of life. We can think that that it is very hard because we are all selfish and proud. However, Christ is the first one who has served us and loved us. Transformed by God's love, we are able to serve and to love those around us. Let us be opened to God's mercy so that we can love in the same way that we have been loved by Christ!

We continue to ask you to register for weekend masses by going to our website (stjohntheevangelistwh.archtoronto.org) and click for register for mass with Eventbrite. The capacity of the Church is limited because of social distance, and we want to make sure that everybody is welcomed. We really encourage everybody to come and attend mass in person. Please encourage families and people that you know to come back to celebrate and worship with us. The weekend masses will be at 5pm on Saturdays, 9am, 11 am and 2 pm in Spanish on Sundays. Confessions will be available again on Saturdays from 4pm to 4:45pm. On Sundays, confessions will be from 1:30pm to 2pm in Spanish. From Thursday, September 23rd at 7:30pm in the Church, we will start the announcement of the Good News. I strongly encourage you to come because we are going to experience in a very deep way how much God loves us and how He wants to fulfill our lives. It will be every Monday and Thursday at 7:30pm in the Church. Come and experience how much God wants to do for us!
