PARISH HOME CATECHISM PROGRAM — Children attending public, private or alternative school are required to participate in this program from grade 1 - 7 in order to prepare to receive the sacraments.

Message from the Pastor

The Peace of Christ be with you all!

We celebrate this Sunday the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. On the First Reading, from the Book of the prophet Jeremiah, we see how the Lord brings back all the exiles to Jerusalem. Those who are in most distress, they will be guided and consoled by the Lord. The Second Reading, from the Letter to the Hebrews, it shows how Jesus Christ is our High Priest since He lives for ever to intercede for us. He has been appointed by God as the One who helps us in our time of need. To Him, we can rely on and find refuge when we find struggles and difficulties. In the Gospel, from St. Mark, we see how Christ heals a blind person as he enters the city of Jericho. Bartimaeus, the blind person, is aware of his blindness and he wants to be healed. He has heard that Christ has the power to heal him. He starts shouting but the disciples and Christ continues walking. It seems that Christ does not pay attention to the blind man, but He wants to see how far he can beg the Lord to heal him. It shows how much this person wanted to be healed. Christ finally stops and He heals him, and the blind man follows Him with great joy. When we are aware that we are in distress it is important to beg the Lord persistently so that He may stop and heal our blindness so that we can experience God's mercy in our lives. Let us beg the Lord insistently so that He may open our eyes to recognize God's love so that we can love others around us!
