

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Peace to all of you!

This Sunday we celebrate the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The First Reading, from the book of the prophet Jeremiah, brings us the account of call of the prophet. At a young age, Jeremiah is called by God to be His messenger. Even though he is inexperienced, and the people are obstinate to God's voice, God chooses a prophet so that His will and His voice can be welcomed by God's people. God has chosen us in our lives for a specific mission. Although we think that we are not prepared to carry it out, it is important that we focus in the One who sends us. He will give us the graces that we need to carry out our mission. The Second Reading, from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, gives us the beautiful hymn to charity. St. Paul says that the greatest charism to which all should aspire is charity. Charity is the unconditional and faithful love of God. St. Paul gives us a presentation of the qualities of such love. It is patient, kind, not boastful, not rude, not resentful, not selfish, endures and bears all things. We must recognize that our love is not so strong, that we sometimes falter. However, we are rooted in God's love, this stature of love will happen in our daily lives. God wants to share his own divine nature with us so that we become like Him. We imitate Him when we love as He loves. What a great gift that God has called us so that our love can be like His. The Gospel, from St. Luke, gives us the account of the visit of Christ to the synagogue of Nazareth. After people were amazed at Jesus' teaching, they start to reject him. Why this change of attitude? They wanted to have Jesus at their service. Instead of being opened to be transformed by Jesus, they wanted Jesus to fulfill their own projects and ideas. Their project was to get rid of the Roman domination and to get rid of all kinds of problems. Jesus is much more than this kind of human messiah; He has come to bring Eternal Life and to deliver us from sin. Jesus reminds them of their obstinacy to receive Him and be transformed by Him. He puts the example of foreigners that welcome God's grace, but instead of creating a change of heart, they became enraged and rejected Him. It is important that we welcome Jesus as the Savior that He is and not as we wish that He will be. Even though there are things that we do not understand about Jesus, such as why God allows suffering and hardships, yet if we are open to His mercy, we can be transformed by Him. Let us open our hearts to God's grace so that our lives may be transformed!

<u>Pope Francis' Homily on the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time</u> (Jan 31, 2016)

Today's Gospel account once again, like last Sunday, brings us to the synagogue of Nazareth, the village in Galilee where Jesus was brought up in a family and was known by everyone. He, who left not long before to begin his public life, now returns and for the first time presents himself to the community, gathered in the synagogue on the Sabbath. He reads the passage of the Prophet Isaiah, who speaks of the future Messiah, and he declares at the end: "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing" (Lk 4:21). Jesus' compatriots, who were at first astonished and admired him, now begin to look sideways, to murmur among themselves and ask: why does he, who claims to be the Lord's Consecrated, not repeat here in his homeland the wonders they say he worked in

Capernaum and in nearby villages? Thus Jesus affirms: "no prophet is acceptable in his own country", and he refers to the great prophets of the past, Elijah and Elisha, who had worked miracles in favour of the pagans in order to denounce the incredulity of their people. At this point those present are offended, rise up, indignant, and cast Jesus out and want to throw him down from the precipice. But he, with the strength of his peace, "passed through the midst of them and went away" (cf. v. 30). His time has not yet come.

This passage of Luke the Evangelist is not simply the account of an argument between compatriots, as sometimes happens even in our neighbourhoods, arising from envy and jealousy, but it highlights a temptation to which a religious man is always exposed — all of us are exposed — and from which it is important to keep his distance. What is this temptation? It is the temptation to consider religion as a human investment and, consequently, "negotiate" with God, seeking one's own interest. Instead, true religion entails accepting the revelation of a God who is Father and who cares for each of his creatures, even the smallest and most insignificant in the eyes of man. Jesus' prophetic ministry consists precisely in this: in declaring that no human condition can constitute a reason for exclusion - no human condition can constitute a reason for exclusion! — from the Father's heart, and that the only privilege in the eyes of God is that of not having privileges, of not having godparents, of being abandoned in his hands.

"Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing" (Lk 4:21). The 'today', proclaimed by Christ that day, applies to every age; it echoes for us too in this Square, reminding us of the relevance and necessity of the salvation Jesus brought to humanity. God comes to meet the men and women of all times and places, in their real life situations. He also comes to meet us. It is always he who takes the first step: he comes to visit us with his mercy, to lift us up from the dust of our sins; he comes to extend a hand to us in order to enable us to return from the abyss into which our pride made us fall, and he invites us to receive the comforting truth of the Gospel and to walk on the paths of good. He always comes to find us, to look for us.

Let us return to the synagogue. Surely that day, in the synagogue of Nazareth, Mary, his Mother was also there. We can imagine her heart beating, a small foreboding of what she will suffer under the Cross, seeing Jesus, there in the synagogue, first admired, then challenged, then insulted, threatened with death. In her heart, filled with faith, she kept every thing. May she help us to convert from a god of miracles to the miracle of God, who is Jesus Christ.

The Synod on Synodality: Share your thoughts

Pope Francis has launched the Synod on Synodality, an ambitious two-year global process of listening to the faithful.

"Synod" comes from an ancient Greek word meaning "walking together on the road." There have been many synods in the history of the Church, but these have traditionally been opportunities for bishops to come together to determine the path forward for the Church.

With the Synod on Synodality, Pope Francis is asking every Catholic to help discern what the Holy Spirit is telling us at this moment as the Church enters its third millennium.

The first phase of the Synod on Syndodality will last through the first half of 2022 and will see the world's faithful sharing their thoughts at a diocesan level. All those diocesan-level responses will be collected and summarized. Then the bishops of Canada will meet to discuss what they heard in their respective dioceses, followed by larger multinational meetings and, ultimately, culminating in a synod of bishops in the Vatican in 2023.
