THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Message from the Pastor

Peace to all of you!

This Sunday we celebrate the Third Sunday of Lent. The First Reading, from the book of Exodus, presents the God's manifestation to Moses at the burning bush. God is concerned with the oppression of the Israelites in Egypt, and He is going to free them from slavery. God chooses Moses to be the instrument of God's liberating act. God is the One who acts powerfully in people's lives. The slavery in Egypt is an image of the slavery to sin. All throughout our lives, but especially during this time of Lent, God wants to free us from our sins. Moreover, He wants to transform our hearts so that we may receive a new life filled with His grace. He is the only One who can overcome our sins. The Second Reading, from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, offers us how St. Paul uses the example of the journey of the people of Israel through the desert so that the community of believers learn from that experience. During the pilgrimage through the wilderness, the people complain against God, and they doubted Him even though they have experienced His marvels. We, as the Corinthians, are called to follow God's plan of salvation with an open and grateful heart. God wants what is good for us. The Gospel, from St. Luke, presents the teaching of Jesus on the need for repentance. When He is asked about why calamities happened at that time, Jesus answers that it is not because they needed to be punished, but it is a call for us to turn back to God. During calamities in the world and the reality of war, it is a call for us to take seriously our lives and open our hearts to the Lord. We do not do it out of fear, but we see how fragile our life is and how we need to put our security and trust in God. Jesus also offers us an image of God's patience with us. When our hearts are hardened, we do not produce fruits of mercy and love. God gives us an opportunity to repent and accept His grace so that our hearts may produce fruits of love in our lives. Let us open our hearts to God's tender mercy so that we can love as He has loved us!

Pope Francis' Homily on the Third Sunday of Lent (March 24, 2019)

And this vinedresser's likeness manifests the mercy of God who leaves us time for conversion. We all need to convert ourselves, to take a step forward; and God's patience and mercy accompanies us in this. Despite the barrenness that marks our lives at times, God is patient and offers us the possibility to change and make progress on the path towards good. However, the deferment requested and received in expectation of the tree bearing fruit also indicates the urgency of conversion. The vinedresser tells the master: "Let it alone, sir, this year also" (v. 8). The

possibility of conversion is not unlimited; thus, it is necessary to seize it immediately; otherwise, it might be lost forever. This Lent, we can consider: what do I have to do to draw nearer to the Lord, to convert myself, to "cut out" those things that are not good? "No, no, I will wait for next Lent". But will I be alive next Lent? Today, let us each think: what must I do before this mercy of God who awaits me and who always forgives? What must I do? We can have great trust in God's mercy but without abusing it. We must not justify spiritual laziness but increase our commitment to respond promptly to this mercy with heartfelt sincerity.

During the time of Lent, the Lord invites us to convert. Each of us must feel addressed by this call, and correct something in our lives, in our way of thinking, of behaving and of living our relationships with others. At the same time, we must imitate the patience of God who trusts in everyone's ability to "rise again" and to continue the journey. God is Father and does not extinguish the weak flame, but rather, accompanies and cares for those who are weak so that they may gain strength and bring their contribution of love to the community. May the Virgin Mary help us to live these days of preparation for Easter as a time of spiritual renewal and trusting openness to the grace of God and his mercy.

Standing up to corporate power in Honduras

The *People and Planet First* campaign is about helping communities stand up to corporate power.

In Honduras, as in much of the Global South, corporations often threaten and criminalize activists who speak up against their abuses.

The Lenca Indigenous leader Víctor Vásquez was imprisoned for fighting the corporate takeover of his people's ancestral territory. Development and Peace's partner, the Honduran Centre for the Promotion of Community Development (CEHPRODEC), helped free him from jail.

Another partner, Caritas Choluteca, trains and accompanies community leaders in advocating for policies that respect human rights and the environment. Recently, they got mayoral election candidates to undertake to declare the municipality of Orocuina a mining-free zone if elected.
