PARISH HOME CATECHISM PROGRAM — Children attending public, private or alternative school are required to participate in this program from grade 1 - 7 in order to prepare to receive the sacraments.

This Sunday we celebrate the Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The First Reading, from the Book of the prophet Amos, presents the admonition of the prophet to the people so that they may treat each other with fairness. At that time, there was a lot of inequality, and many people were treated unjustly. Amos reminds them to act with justice and fairness, especially towards the poor and needy. The Second Reading, from the Letter of St. Paul to Timothy, gives us his advice to pray for every person on earth so that we may live a peaceful life. This prayer should be done from a heart that is at peace with everybody. Based on God's plan that He wants everybody to be saved, we should pray for all people, without distinction, so that they can experience God's mercy in their lives. Even those who are far away from God, He wants that they may still receive His mercy. It should fill us with hope to see that anybody can be open to God's love. The Gospel, from St. Luke, offers us the account of the astute administrator. The shrewdness of this person is praised because he survives a very difficult situation. Jesus uses this parable to encourage us to be as quick and resolute regarding our eternal salvation. We should respond promptly to God's invitation to receive his abundant life. This is what is more important because it's what endures for ever. Let us answer with promptness to enter God's kingdom in our daily lives!

I really encourage you attend and to experience how much God loves us and to experience His mercy in our lives. It is free and you do not need to sign up, just come and listen to Him. It will take place in the Church, and it will be Mondays and Thursdays at the same time. Come, the Lord is waiting for you!

A New Year for Youth Ministry:


