PARISH HOME CATECHISM PROGRAM — Children attending public, private or alternative school are required to participate in this program from grade 1 - 7 in order to prepare to receive the sacraments.

Message from the Pastor

Peace to all of you!

This Sunday we celebrate the Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The First Reading, from the Book of Exodus, presents the episode of the battle of the people of Israel against Amalek. The people are victorious as long as Moses is praying interceding for them. In our every day lives, we are called to persevere in prayer to face our struggles. If we pray constantly, we are at peace, if not, we will get discouraged and sooner or later we will give up. It is important to pray so that we can find strength and consolation in the Lord. The Second Reading, from the Second Letter of St. Paul to Timothy, is an exhortation to remain steadfast in the faith that he has received through the tradition and the word of God. We are also encouraged to be faithful and to rely in the Scriptures as a sure guide for our lives. It is through the word of God that is proclaimed in the Church that our faith is confirmed and we find strength to face any difficulties in life. Let us meditate on a regular basis the word of God so that we find consolation and peace. The Gospel, from St. Luke, shows us the episode of persistent widow who asks a merciless judge to do justice to her. She gets the help that she needs because she asks with perseverance. We are encouraged to be persistent in our prayers and to pray constantly. It is not that we need to convince God; rather, when we pray, we rely in God and we receive the grace to accept whatever event may happen in our lives. When encounter difficulties, it is easy to be discouraged and not to pray as much, it seems that God does not answer. However, if we are faithful to prayer and we realize that God is the only one who can help us, then we will find the strength to go on with our lives at peace. Let us persevere in prayer and we will find help in time need!

On Mondays and Thursdays at 7:30pm, we are having the Announcement of the Good News in the Church. I really encourage you attend and to experience how much God loves us and to experience His mercy in our lives. It is free and you do not need to sign up, just come and listen to Him. Come, the Lord is waiting for you!

Pope Francis' Homily on the Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time (October 20,2013)

In today's Gospel Jesus tells a parable on the need to pray always, never wearying. The main character is a widow whose insistent pleading with a dishonest judge succeeds in obtaining justice from him. Jesus concludes: if the widow succeeded in convincing that judge, do you think that God will not listen to us if we pray to him with insistence? Jesus' words are very strong: "And will not God vindicate his elect, who cry to him day and night?" (Lk 18:7).

"Crying day and night" to God! This image of prayer is striking, but let us ask ourselves: Why does God want this? Doesn't he already know what we need? What does it mean to "insist" with God?

This is a good question that makes us examine an important aspect of the faith: God invites us to pray insistently not because he is unaware of our needs or because he is not listening to us. On the contrary, he is always listening and he knows everything about us lovingly. On our daily journey, especially in times of difficulty, in the battle against the evil that is outside and within us, the Lord is not far away, he is by our side. We battle with him beside us, and our weapon is prayer which makes us feel his presence beside us, his mercy and also his help. But the battle against evil is a long and hard one; it requires patience and endurance, like Moses who had to keep

his arms outstretched for the people to prevail (cf Ex 17:8-13). This is how it is: there is a battle to be waged each day, but God is our ally, faith in him is our strength and prayer is the expression of this faith. Therefore Jesus assures us of the victory, but at the end he asks: "when the Son of man comes, will he find faith on earth?" (Lk 18:8). If faith is snuffed out, prayer is snuffed out, and we walk in the dark. We become lost on the path of life.

Therefore, let us learn from the widow of the Gospel to pray always without growing weary. This widow was very good! She knew how to battle for her children! I think of the many women who fight for their families, who pray and never grow weary. Today let us all remember these women who by their attitude provide us with a true witness of faith and courage, and a model of prayer. Our thoughts go out to them!

Pray always, but not in order to convince the Lord by dint of words! He knows our needs better than we do! Indeed persevering prayer is the expression of faith in a God who calls us to fight with him every day and at every moment in order to conquer evil with good.


