TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Message from the Pastor

The Peace of Christ be with you all!

I hope you have had a great and restful summer. We celebrate this Sunday the Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time. The First Reading is from the book of Joshua. It presents the passage in which God wants to renew the covenant with His people Israel. After they have come out of Egypt, they passed through the desert, they now have established themselves in the Promised Land. After they have experienced how God has been good with them, they now are called to renew their willingness to follow the Lord. If they do so, they will experience fulfillment and happiness. The Second Reading, from the Letter of the apostle St. Paul to the Ephesians, gives us a teaching on the relationship between husband and wife in marriage. Through God's grace, Christ can make them love each other unconditionally. They are called to be in communion and be an image of God's love for us and Christ's love for His Church. What a beautiful call that our love can be elevate to such a degree! The Gospel, from St. John, brings us the last part of the Discourse on the Bread of Life. After Christ has clearly proclaimed that He is the Bread of Life and that to have life we need to eat His Body and drink His Blood, people do not want to follow Him anymore because of the severity of His teaching. However, St. Peter, on behalf of the disciples, is willing to follow Him because He has experience that only in Christ there is fulness of life. Let us also be willing to follow Christ in our lives to find fullness of peace and joy!

Fr. Francisco Fernandez, Your servant and your Pastor May the Lord welcome into His Kingdom Fr. Andrew Macbeth, Pastor of St. John the Evangelist from 1991 to 2003. He has been a faithful priest for 49 years and has brought many people to Christ. Let us pray for his soul and his family and let us be grateful for the ministry that he carried out in our parish.

<u>Pope Francis Homily for the Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time B (August 22, 2021)</u>

The Gospel of today's liturgy (Jn 6:60-69) shows us the reaction of the crowd and the disciples to Jesus' discourse following the multiplication of the loaves. Jesus invited them to interpret that sign and believe in Him, who is the true bread come down from heaven, the bread of life; and He revealed that the bread He will give is His body and blood. These words sound harsh and incomprehensible to the ears of the people, so much so that, from that moment, the Gospel says, many of His disciples turn back; that is, they stop following the Master (vv. 60, 66). Then Jesus asks the Twelve: "Do you also wish to go away?" (v. 67), and Peter, on behalf of the whole group, confirms their decision to stay with Him: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life; and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God" (Jn 6:68-69). And it is a beautiful confession of faith.

Let us look briefly at the attitude of those who withdrew and did not follow Jesus anymore. Where does this disbelief come from? What is the reason for this rejection?

Jesus' words enkindled great scandal: He was saying that God decided to manifest Himself and accomplish salvation in the weakness of human flesh. It is the mystery of incarnation. The incarnation of God is what provoked scandal and presented an obstacle for those people - but often for us too. Indeed, Jesus affirms that the true bread of salvation, which transmits eternal life,

is His very flesh; that to enter into communion with God, before observing the laws or satisfying religious precepts, it is necessary to live out a real and concrete relationship with Him. Because salvation came from Him, in His incarnation. This means that one must not pursue God in dreams and in images of grandeur and power, but He must be recognised in the humanity of Jesus and, as a consequence, in that of the brothers and sisters we meet on the path of life. God made Himself flesh. And when we say this, in the Creed, on Christmas Day, on the Day of the Annunciation, we kneel to worship this mystery of incarnation. God made Himself flesh and blood: He lowered himself to the point of becoming a man like us. He humbled Himself to the extent of burdening Himself with our sufferings and sin, and therefore He asks us to not seek Him outside life and history, but in relationship with Christ and with our brothers and sisters. Seeking Him in life, in history, in our daily life. And this, brothers and sisters, is the road to the encounter with God: the relationship with Christ and our brothers and sisters.

PARISH HOME CATECHISM PROGRAM (PHCP) 2024-25

St. John the Evangelist PHCP provides faith formation classes for elementary school children. Our mission is to assist parents in developing the Catholic Faith in their children. In order to help students who do not attend Catholic school develop the faith foundation necessary to receive the sacraments, they are required to attend PHCP from grades 1 - 8. The PHCP runs 2 Wednesday evenings per month, 6:15 – 7:15 p.m., September through to May. Classes begin Wednesday, September 11th 2024 with a Meet and Greet registration/activity evening.

PHCP REGISTRATION:

Registration for PHCP begins Wednesday, August 21 and will be open until Wednesday, September 11, 2024.

For your convenience, registration forms are now available on the parish website, at the back of the Church or in the Parish Office. Please register in person in the parish office during regular business hours or you may place your registration package, labelled PHCP in the Sunday collection basket.

Please Note: Parents/guardians are required to provide at registration baptismal records for their children who are NEW to the PHCP and who were not baptized at St. John the Evangelist Church.
