EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Message from the Pastor

Peace to all of you!

This Sunday we celebrate the Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The First Reading, from the book of Ecclesiasticus, presents a moral teaching on how to evaluate the purpose or goal of an action. Whatever we say or do, we act on it moved by the state of our heart. If we are at peace, our actions and words will be constructive and full of gratitude. On the other hand, if our hearts are not at peace, we harm others by our words and actions. It is important to realize how essential it is that I am at peace with God and with others and then my actions will bring good to others. The Second Reading, from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, shows us the final portion of the teaching on Christ's Resurrection. The Risen Lord is victorious over sin and death and wants us to share with us His victory. In Him, we can be transformed from attitudes and words that are sinful to ways of action that are holy and full of love. We need to be aware of our sinful attitudes, offer them to Christ and He offers us in return a new life, a new of living with love and peace. The Gospel, from St. Luke, continues with the Sermon on the Mount. Christ presents to us some teachings on the importance of having a proper and sound attitude. If we are aware of our faults and we experience God's mercy, then we are compassionate with others and peaceful. However, if we think that we are always right or we cannot accept our own mistakes, then we will be demanding with others and we will become angry with others' faults. Let us open our hearts to the Lord and recognize his mercy in front of our weaknesses so that we can be merciful with others in our daily lives!

<u>Pope Francis' Angelus for the Eighth Sunday in Ordinary time (February 20, 2022)</u>

Today's Gospel passage presents brief parables with which Jesus seeks to indicate to his disciples the path to follow in order to live wisely. With the question: can a blind man lead a blind man?" (Lk 6:39), he wishes to emphasize that a leader cannot be blind, but must see clearly, that is, he must have wisdom in order to lead wisely, otherwise he risks causing damage to the people who are entrusted to him. Jesus thus calls attention to those who have educational responsibility or who govern: spiritual pastors, public authorities, legislators, teachers, parents, exhorting them to be aware of their delicate role and to always discern the right path on which to lead people.

And Jesus borrows a wise expression in order to designate himself as an example of teacher and leader to be followed: "A disciple is not above his teacher, but every one when he is fully taught will be like his teacher" (v. 40). It is a call to follow his example and his teaching in order to be sound and wise leaders. And this teaching is included above all in the Sermon on the Mount — which, in the past three Sundays the liturgy has offered us in the Gospel — indicating the attitude of meekness and of mercy in order to be honest, humble and just people. In today's passage we find another significant phrase, which exhorts us to be neither presumptuous nor hypocritical. It says: "Why do you see the

speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye?" (v. 41).

PENANCE IN LENT

Fridays in the Lenten Season are days of penance, when small sacrifices are encouraged. Abstaining from meat on Fridays has become a customary Lenten penance for Catholics. The Canadian Bishops have recommended that this penitential practice continue among the faithful, but also stated that other acts of penance may be substituted, such as special prayers or acts of service for others.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of obligatory fasting and abstinence from meat. "The law of fasting prescribes that only one meal be taken in a day; but it does not forbid taking some nourishment in the morning and evening" (Letters & Legislation, Archdiocese of Toronto). The law of fasting binds those from 18 to 59 years of age, while the law of abstinence from meat binds Catholics who are 14 years of age and older, but every person, regardless of age, can participate in fasting and abstaining from meat if they wish, as long as one's health will allow it.

Parents and educators are reminded of their duty to introduce children gradually to the understanding and practice of penance, including fasting and abstinence, in the life of Catholics. Adult example will be the greatest influence in this matter (Guidelines for Pastoral Liturgy, 1999-2000, CCCB).


