THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Message from the Pastor

Peace to all of you!

This Sunday we celebrate the Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time. The First Reading, from the prophet Malachi, encourages the people of Israel to remain faithful to the Lord in spite of passing through difficulties. Apparently, the unjust people get away with their wrongdoings; however, in the long run, they will reap nothing, they will remain empty. Even though the just person suffers injustices, they will be at peace, and they will have fulness of life. The Lord is encouraging us to persevere and remain faithful to Him because we will certainly reap out fruits. The Second Reading, from the Second Letter of St. Paul to the Thessalonians, offers us the advice to continue to be active in the spiritual life. It is very easy to grow weak and not to be persistent. It happens when we are not connected with the Lord, and we lose hope. If we are not looking for anything, we start being complacent and we get spiritually lazy. The consequence is that everything in our lives becomes heavy and it upsets us. However, if we are attached to the Lord, we find hope in Him, and He guides our lives. We are active and we have the strength to face whatever comes our way. Let us ask to the Lord the gift of perseverance and to remain spiritually active in the Lord. The Gospel, from St. Luke, presents to us the beginning of the eschatological discourse of Jesus. As we are approaching the end of the liturgical year, He tells us that sooner or later everything around us will finish, it will end. Even though we see wars, catastrophes and other disasters happening, the Lord is inviting us not to panic, all this is normal in our fragile world. We live in a world that is not eternal, and all these things have happened and will continue to happen. In front of these situations, we need to find refuge and strength in the Lord. He will keep us standing and our hearts will rest secure. He remains forever and will give us hope to know that in Him we have Eternal Life. We need to persevere with hope knowing that this world will disappear, but we belong to the citizenship of Heaven. Let us put our hope in the Lord knowing that we will find strength in Him, and He will help us to persevere!

Let us continue pray for our deceased relatives and friends during the month of November! Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

On Mondays and Thursdays at 7:30pm we are having the announcement of the Good News in our parish. I really encourage you attend and to experience how much God loves us and to witness His mercy in our lives. It is free and you do not need to sign up, just come and listen to Him. Come, the Lord is waiting for you!

Pope Benedict XVI's Angelus on the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (November 18, 2007)

In today's Gospel passage, St Luke reproposes the Biblical view of history for our reflection and refers to Jesus' words that invite the disciples not to fear, but to face difficulties, misunderstandings and even persecutions with trust, persevering through faith in him. The Lord says: "When you hear of wars and tumults, do not be terrified; for this must first take place, but the end will not be at once" (Lk 21: 9). Keeping this admonition in mind, from the beginning the Church lives in prayerful waiting for her Lord, scrutinizing the signs of the times and putting the faithful on guard against recurring messiahs, who from time to time announce the world's end as imminent. In reality, history must run its course, which brings with it also human

dramas and natural calamities. In it a design of salvation is developed that Christ has already brought to fulfilment in his Incarnation, death and Resurrection. The Church continues to proclaim this mystery and to announce and accomplish it with her preaching, celebration of the sacraments and witness of charity.

Dear brothers and sisters, let us welcome Christ's invitation to face daily events by trusting in his providential love. Let us not fear the future, even when it can appear with bleak colours, because the God of Jesus Christ, who entered history to open it to its transcendent fulfilment, is the alpha and the omega, the first and the last (cf. Rv 1: 8). He guarantees that in every little but genuine act of love there is the entire sense of the universe, and that the one who does not hesitate to lose his own life for him finds it again in fullness (cf. Mt 16: 25).

With remarkable effectiveness, consecrated persons, who have placed their lives completely at the service of the Kingdom of God, invite us to keep this perspective alive. Among these I would like to particularly recall those called to contemplation in cloistered monasteries. The Church dedicates a special day to them this Wednesday, 21 November, Memorial of the Presentation in the Temple of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We owe much to these people who live on what Providence provides them through the generosity of the faithful. "As a spiritual oasis, a monastery reminds today's world of the most important, and indeed, in the end, the only decisive thing: that there is an ultimate reason why life is worth living: God and his unfathomable love" (Pope Benedict XVI, Heiligenkreuz, Austria, 9 September 2007). Faith, which is active in charity, is the true antidote against a nihilistic mentality that is spreading its influence in the world even more in our time.

May Mary, Mother of the Incarnate Word, accompany us on our earthly pilgrimage. We ask her to sustain the witness of all Christians, so that it is always based on a solid and persevering faith.
