OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Message from the Pastor

Peace to all of you!

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ, the King of the Universe. With this Solemnity we conclude the liturgical year as we emphasize that the culmination of the history of the world is that Christ reigns over all Creation. The First Reading, from the Second Book of Samuel, presents to us the episode of the anointing of David as king of Israel. He is a prefiguration of the true King, who is Jesus Christ. As David was anointed king, Jesus Christ was anointed by the Holy Spirit and publicly recognized by His Father when He was baptized. We are encouraged to follow and find life in Jesus, who reigns with peace, justice, and mercy. The Second Reading, from the Letter of St. Paul to the Colossians, offers us the Hymn to Christ as the Savior of the world. Through Christ, we have been freed from sin and called to share in a new life. He is the culmination and fulfillment of our lives. If we place our hope and trust in Him, we will find fulness of life in Heaven with the Lord. The Gospel, from St. Luke, gives us a portion of Jesus' crucifixion. At the Cross, Jesus has manifested what kind of King He is. He is One who is humble, merciful, and forgiving. Despite our sins and shortcomings. He offers us redemption. salvation, and Eternal Life. In the Cross. we find the fullest manifestation of Christ's love for us: unconditional and until the end. We are encouraged to have Christ the King as the center of our lives and the Cross as the source of all graces. What a gift to have such a King who has given His life for us and who dies so that we may live eternally. Let us anchor our lives in the King of Kings who loves us so much!

Let us continue pray for our deceased relatives and friends during the month of November! Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

On Mondays and Thursdays at 7:30pm we are having the announcement of the Good News in our parish. I really encourage you attend and to experience how much God loves us and to witness His mercy in our lives. It is free and you do not need to sign up, just come and listen to Him. Come, the Lord is waiting for you!

Pope Benedict XVI's Angelus on the Solemnity of Christ the King (November 21, 20010)

Dear Brothers and Sisters, The Liturgy of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King of the Universe in the Vatican Basilica has just ended. It was also concelebrated by the 24 new Cardinals created at yesterday's Consistory. The Solemnity of Christ the King was established by Pius XI in 1925 and, later, after the Second Vatican Council, it was placed at the close of the liturgical year. The Gospel according to St Luke presents, as in a great painting, the kingship of Jesus at the moment of his Crucifixion. The leaders of the people and the soldiers taunt "the first-born of all creation" (Col 1:15) and put him to the test to see whether he has the power to save himself from death (cf. Luke 23:35-37).

Yet precisely: "on the Cross, Jesus is exalted to the very 'height' of the God who is Love. It is there that he can be 'known'.... Jesus gives us 'life' because he gives us God. He can give God because he himself is one with God" (Benedict XVI, Jesus of Nazareth (English translation, Doubleday, New York, 2007, pp. 349 and 354). In fact, while the Lord seems to be mistaken because he is between two wrong-doers, one of them, aware of his sins, opens himself to truth, arrives at faith and prays "the King of the Jews": "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Lk 23:42).

From the One who "is before all things, and in him all things hold together" (Col 1:17) the so-called "Good Thief" straight away receives forgiveness and the joy of entering the Kingdom of Heaven. "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise" (Lk 23:43). With these words, Jesus, from the throne of the Cross welcomes every human being with infinite mercy. St Ambrose comments that this "is a beautiful example of conversion to which one should aspire: forgiveness is very quickly offered to the thief and grace is more abundant than the request; the Lord in fact", St Ambrose says, "always gives more than is asked for Life is being with Christ because where Christ is there is the Kingdom" (Expositio Ev. sec. Lucam X, 121: ccl 14, 379).

Dear Friends, we can also contemplate in Christian art the way of love that the Lord reveals to us and invites us to take. In fact, in the past "in the arrangement of Christian sacred buildings... it became customary to depict the Lord returning as a king — the symbol of hope — at the east end; while the west wall normally portrayed the Last Judgement as a symbol of our

responsibility for our lives" (Encyclical Spe Salvi, n. 41): hope in the infinite love of God and commitment to ordering our life in accordance with the love of God.

When we contemplate depictions of Jesus inspired by the New Testament — as an ancient Council teaches — we are led to "understand... the sublimity and the humiliation of the Word of God and... to remember his life in the flesh, his Passion and his salvific death, and the redemption that the world derived from it" (Council in Trullo, [691 or 692], can. 82).

"Yes, we need it, precisely to... become capable of recognizing in the pierced heart of the Crucified One the mystery of God" (J. Ratzinger, Teologia della liturgia: La fondazione sacramentale dell'esistenza cristiana, LEV 2010, p. 69).

The Advent Season begins next week

The Catholic Church Liturgical Year starts with the 1st Sunday of Advent on Sunday November 30, 2025.

Advent is a time of preparation for the coming of Christ at Christmas. Latin "adventus" (Preparation)

Marks the four Sundays before Christmas

Advent Wreaths

Part of our spiritual preparation for Christmas. Christ is "the Light that came into the world" to dispel the darkness of sin and to radiate the truth and love of God (John 3:19-21).

- The wreath is made of various evergreens, signifying continuous life.
- The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the everlasting life found in Christ.
- \cdot The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent.

The purple candles symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and goods works undertaken at this time.

The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday which is called Gaudete Sunday. It is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent,

when their preparation is now half over, and they are close to Christmas.

- · Only one purple candle is lit during the first week, two in the second week, three (incl. the pink one) in the third week, and all four during the fourth week of Advent The gradually increasing light symbolizes the approach of Christmas, the birth of Jesus, the light of the world.
- · <u>A fifth candle (white)</u> can be added in the middle of the wreath for Christmas Eve and Day (or replace all four purple and pink candles with white ones) symbolizing the arrival of Christ, the light of the world. Light the white candle(s) until The Baptism of the Lord.



Families are encouraged to observe Advent by gathering around a wreath for brief Advent prayers and readings lighting the appropriate

number of candles for each week. Traditions assign specific symbolism to each of the candles:

- 1) The Prophet's Candle, symbolizing Hope
- 2) The Bethlehem Candle, symbolizing Love & Faith
- 3) The Shepherd's Candle, symbolizing Joy
- 4) The Angel's Candle, symbolizing Peace.

MAID - Medical Assisted Death

In an ongoing effort to protect the vulnerable population from choosing MAID(Medical Assistance in Dying), a Private Members bill has been introduced into the House of Commons. Bill C-218 recognizes that mental illness is treatable with adequate community supports and is requesting that people suffering solely from a mental illness be excluded from eligibility for MAID.

Please support Bill C-218 in the signature campaign sponsored in our parish. Individuals suffering from a mental illness have the potential to lead a fruitful life with our prayers and with community supports. Your support of this bill will be recognized in the House of Commons. Any signatures collected on either a provided letter or collective petition will be presented in the House of Commons by the Member of Parliament presenting the bill on December 5th.
