



PARISH REGISTRATION — All parishioners especially those who live outside our parish boundaries are expected to complete a Parish Registration form and use Sunday Offertory Envelopes. This will greatly assist the Parish Team when parishioners request sacraments, funerals or letters of reference.

N.B. — When parishioners move you are asked to notify the parish office.

INFANT BAPTISMS — Two Sundays per month at 4:00 p.m. Contact the parish office at least two months in advance of the birth of their child. Parents are obliged to participate in our baptismal preparation program.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE — The Archdiocese of Toronto requires that you contact your parish priest at least one year in advance of the planned date of your wedding and that you participate in a marriage preparation course.

PARISH HOME CATECHISM PROGRAM — Children attending public, private or alternative school are required to participate in this program from grade 1 - 7 in order to prepare to receive the sacraments.

VISITATION OF THE SICK — Please notify the Rectory when a member of your family is in the hospital.

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Message from the Pastor

Peace to all of you!

This Sunday we celebrate the Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time. The First Reading, from the Book of the prophet Isaiah, offers us a teaching on how to act with the those around us. The people of Israel have come back to Jerusalem from the exile in Babylon. However, the attitude has not changed, and people still commit injustices and care about themselves. In front of this behavior, the prophet exhorts them that the true devotion is to do good for others, to care for those around them. The right relationship with God is recognized in our love for our neighbour. Our prayers should open our hearts to help those around us. The Second Reading, from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, presents us a message in which the apostle explains what the strength of his preaching is. He does not count on his eloquence and wisdom, but in the power of the Holy Spirit. First, St. Paul had a very strong relationship with Christ, and he has experienced God's action in his life. Based on this essential fact, he was announcing the Gospel not to persuade and convince people, but to share what he had lived. Many times, we try to understand and to comprehend the Scriptures and God's action in our lives. It is very difficult to analyze them because it goes well beyond our understanding. It is better to be open to the action of the Holy Spirit and to be amazed at the marvels that God can and want to do in our lives. We should rely more in God's grace than in our efforts and we would be surprised at God's marvellous deeds. The Gospel, from St. Matthew, continues with Jesus' teaching on the Sermon of the Mountain. As disciples of Jesus, we are called to be salt of the earth and light of the world. Salt gives taste to food and preserves food from corruption. As followers of Jesus, we have been transformed by God's mercy, and our attitudes are supposed to be peaceful and gentle. We are called to give the flavour of hope and love to a world that at times is blend with discouragement and hopelessness. We are also encouraged to be light of the world. The light indicates where we are going, and it gives direction and purpose. We have been enlightened by Christ when our lives are fulfilled, and we are able to love each other. We are called to enlighten those around us by our attitudes so that they can receive the light of Christ and be transformed. Let us participate in this wonderful mission of sharing our faith with others. If we have been salted and enlightened by Christ, those around us will experience God's mercy and they in turn will be transformed!

Pope Benedict's Angelus on the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time (February 6, 2011)

In this Sunday's Gospel the Lord Jesus tells his disciples: "You are the salt of the earth.... You are the light of the world" (Mt 5:13,14). With these richly evocative images he wishes to pass on to them the meaning of their mission and their witness. Salt, in the cultures of the Middle East, calls to mind several values such as the Covenant, solidarity, life and wisdom. Light is the first work of God the Creator and is a source of life; the word of God is compared to light, as the Psalmist proclaims: "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Ps 119[118]:105).

And, again in today's Liturgy, the Prophet Isaiah says: "If you pour yourself out for the hungry and satisfy the desire of the afflicted, then shall your light rise in the darkness and your gloom be as the noonday" (58:10). Wisdom sums up in itself the beneficial effects of salt and light: in fact, disciples of the Lord are called to give a new "taste" to the world and to keep it from corruption with the

wisdom of God, which shines out in its full splendour on the Face of the Son because he is "the true light that enlightens every man" (Jn 1:9).

United to him, in the darkness of indifference and selfishness, Christians can diffuse the light of God's love, true wisdom that gives meaning to human life and action. Next 11 February, the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes, we shall celebrate the World Day of the Sick. It is a favourable opportunity on which to reflect, to pray and to increase the sensitivity that the ecclesial communities and civil society show to our sick brothers and sisters. In the Message for this Day, inspired by a sentence from the First Letter of Peter, "By his wounds you have been healed" (1 Pt 2:24), I invite everyone to contemplate Jesus, the Son of God, who suffered and died but is Risen. God radically opposes the overbearingness of evil. The Lord takes care of human beings in every situation, he shares in their suffering and opens their hearts to hope. I therefore urge all health-care workers to recognize in the sick person not only a body marked by frailty but first and foremost a person, to whom they should give full solidarity and offer appropriated and qualified help.

PENANCE IN LENT

Fridays in the Lenten Season are days of penance, when small sacrifices are encouraged. Abstaining from meat on Fridays has become a customary Lenten penance for Catholics. The Canadian Bishops have recommended that this penitential practice continue among the faithful, but also stated that other acts of penance may be substituted, such as special prayers or acts of service for others.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of obligatory fasting and abstinence from meat. "The law of fasting prescribes that only one meal be taken in a day; but it does not forbid taking some nourishment in the morning and evening" (Letters & Legislation, Archdiocese of Toronto). The law of fasting binds those from 18 to 59 years of age, while the law of abstinence from meat binds Catholics who are 14 years of age and older, but every person, regardless of age, can participate in fasting and abstaining from meat if they wish, as long as one's health will allow it.

Parents and educators are reminded of their duty to introduce children gradually to the understanding and practice of penance, including fasting and abstinence, in the life of Catholics. Adult example will be the greatest influence in this matter (Guidelines for Pastoral Liturgy, 1999-2000, CCCB).

A reminder that during Fridays in Lent, Stations of the Cross begin at 6:30pm, followed by Mass at 7:00pm. Stations in Spanish are at 7:30pm. There is no morning mass on Fridays in Lent.
