



**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE —** The Archdiocese of Toronto requires that you contact your parish priest at least one year in advance of the planned date of your wedding and that you participate in a marriage preparation course.

**PARISH HOME CATECHISM PROGRAM —** Children attending public, private or alternative school are required to participate in this program from grade 1 - 7 in order to prepare to receive the sacraments.

**VISITATION OF THE SICK —** Please notify the Rectory when a member of your family is in the hospital.

## SIXTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Message from the Pastor

Peace to all of you!

This Sunday we celebrate the Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time. The First Reading, from the Book of Sirach, offers us a wisdom passage in which God encourages people to keep the commandments. We have been created with the freedom to choose. We can either choose goodness and find life or choose evil and find death. God's commandments are not burdensome or demanding, they are rather a path to life. With God's grace, we can act according to God's commandments and find peace, fulfillment and happiness. The Second Reading, from the First Letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, gives us a meditation on Christian wisdom. To be wise in society is to know a lot of things and to be skilled in so many trades. It has the risk that it is for oneself, for self perfection and not for the building of others. The wisdom of a disciple of Christ is based on the experience that God acts in our personal lives. It always seeks the good of others, and it is always diffusive, not self centered. It is a wisdom that comes from the experience of life events and not knowledge of books. The wise person is the one who has lived long enough and knows where the truth of life lies. Let us ask the Lord that we may grow in true wisdom. The Gospel, from St. Matthew, continues with the Sermon of the Mount. Jesus Christ has come to fulfill for us God's commandments. On our own, we realize that we fail to keep his commandments, and they may seem a burden. However, Christ has been sent to teach us the real meaning of the commandments as a path to life. Moreover, He also gives us the grace to keep them without effort. He gives us the possibility to love unconditionally each other and to reconcile with those around us. He allows us to see the person next to us with respect and with dignity and not with lust. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we can act in a way that whatever we do is always for the good of others. It is important to realize that God does not expect too

much of us but rather He wants to give us so much. Let us be open to God's grace and we will be able to love completely.

This Wednesday we start the time of Lent with Ash Wednesday which will bring us to be transformed and renewed at Easter. Let us allow the grace of God to transform us completely!

Pope Benedict's Angelus on the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time (February 13, 2011)

In this Sunday's Liturgy we continue to read Jesus' so-called "Sermon on the Mount". It is contained in chapters 5, 6 and 7 of Matthew's Gospel. After the Beatitudes, which are the programme of his life, Jesus proclaims the new Law, his Torah, as our Jewish brothers and sisters call it. In fact, on his coming, the Messiah was also to bring the definitive revelation of the Law and this is precisely what Jesus declares: "Think not that I have come to abolish the Law and the Prophets; I have come not to abolish them but to fulfil them". Addressing his disciples, he adds: "unless your righteousness exceeds that of the Scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven" (Mt 5:17,20). But what do this "fullness" of Christ's Law and this "superior" justice that he demands consist in? Jesus explains it with a series of antitheses between the old commandments and his new way of propounding them. He begins each time: "You have heard that it was said to the men of old...", and then he asserts: "but I say to you".... For example, "You have heard that it was said to the men of old, 'you shall not kill; and whoever kills shall be liable to judgement'. But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother shall be liable to judgement" (Mt 5:21-22). He does this six times. This manner of speaking made a great impression on the people, who were shocked, because those words: "I say to you" were equivalent to claiming the actual authority of God,

the source of the Law. The newness of Jesus consists essentially in the fact that he himself "fulfils" the commandments with the love of God, with the power of the Holy Spirit who dwells within him. And we, through faith in Christ, can open ourselves to the action of the Holy Spirit who makes us capable of living divine love. So it is that every precept becomes true as a requirement of love, and all join in a single commandment: love God with all your heart and love your neighbour as yourself. "Love is the fulfilling of the Law", St Paul writes (Rom 13:10).

With regard to this requirement, for example, the pitiful case of the four Rom children, who died last week when their shack caught fire on the outskirts of this city, forces us to ask ourselves whether a more supportive and fraternal society, more consistent in love, in other words more Christian, might not have been able to prevent this tragic event. And this question applies in the case of so many other grievous events, more or less known, which occur daily in our cities and our towns.

### PENANCE IN LENT

Fridays in the Lenten Season are days of penance, when small sacrifices are encouraged. Abstaining from meat on Fridays has become a customary Lenten penance for Catholics. The Canadian Bishops have recommended that this penitential practice continue among the faithful, but also stated that other acts of penance may be substituted, such as special prayers or acts of service for others.

**Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** are days of obligatory fasting and abstinence from meat. "The law of fasting prescribes that only one meal be taken in a day; but it does not forbid taking some nourishment in the morning and evening" ([Letters & Legislation](#), Archdiocese of Toronto). The law of fasting binds those from 18 to 59 years of age, while the law of abstinence from meat binds Catholics who are 14 years of age and older, but every person, regardless of age, can participate in fasting and abstaining from meat if they wish, as long as one's health will allow it.

Parents and educators are reminded of their duty to introduce children gradually to the understanding and practice of penance, including fasting and abstinence, in the life of Catholics. Adult example will be the greatest influence in this matter (Guidelines for Pastoral Liturgy, 1999-2000, CCCB).

**A reminder that during Fridays in Lent, Stations of the Cross begin at 6:30pm, followed by Mass at 7:00pm. Stations in Spanish are at 7:30pm. There is no morning mass on Fridays in Lent.**


